Introduction

Why do we have this idea that we help Jesus in our salvation?

**“I will never fall away,” says the first of the disciples, putting his trust in his faithfulness to Jesus.
(30-35)**

Peter doesn't comfort Jesus when he asks for it. (36-46)

Peter can't defend Jesus when he is betrayed. (47-56)

Peter doesn't speak up when Jesus is condemned. (57-68)

Peter doesn't even want to be associated with Jesus. (69-75)

So what does that mean for you?

**“I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.”
(Galatians 2:20)**
